Upon completion of their reading, each student should complete the following questions and bring the answers to school with them the first week of school. The answers are to be written in complete sentences restating the question as they answer the question.

1. What happens to Julia to make her wish she wasn't Korean?
2. Why does Julia not want to do the silkworm project?
3. If Linda Sue Parks had written a conversation between chapters 15 and 16 what do you think would have been written?
4. Why didn't Julia tell Patrick sooner that she didn't want to do the project? How would the story have been different if she had told him sooner?
5. Look up the words prejudice and racism. What are the differences between those two words according to their definitions? Were there any examples of prejudice or racism in the story? What are some real life examples of prejudice and racism throughout history?

You may answer these questions on a piece of loose leaf and staple this paper to the sheet. Be sure your name is on the piece of loose leaf.
